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
#### What is Penn's Dance Marathon Club (DMC) all about?


#### Second Grade News



#### 4th grade

It's full STEAM ahead for Horizon's fourth grade students. The integration of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math is alive in 4th grade. During one science rotation, students designed simple machines to complete a design challenge. The engineering standards that include simple machines were emphasized. In life science, one of the lab activities was to dissect owl pellets. Students used the scientific process and lab procedures to gain knowledge of the food chain. They uncovered skeletal remains of the owl's prey. During the coding rotation, students created their own game using Scratch software. Using logic and reasoning, students created the code and designed their own video game. Such fun!

In January, Mrs. Kinney, the technology coordinator, brought in bots and Ipads for students in Mrs. Pond's math class. These children had the opportunity to code their own bot! Students used the bots called, Dash, to move the bot in a specific direction, pick up that object, and then launched the item, thus completing the mission. Also this month, students had fun creating with clay during SmART. They used their creativity to mold their creations for the "Coil Cafe".

Fifth grade enjoyed a special guest last month when Mr. Al came and shared his experience of growing up in Iraq. He shared how he watched his country change under different government leadership, how education is vastly different, and how he came to America. His visit was in conjunction with a novel students recently read: *Refugee*, by Alan Gratz. This book was about three different kids, all facing unimaginable dangers and how they became refugees, needing to leave their countries. Mr. Al's visit attested to the challenges and adjustments that people make when they leave their countries of origin to begin life afresh. We enjoyed his visit immensely!

#### PE News



During January students have been learning about the winter game of Floor Hockey. This is something that I really enjoy teaching because no matter how old our students are, they can play! Our sticks were a little big for the Pre-K kids, but we made it work!

The 3rd & 5th graders also participated in the Heart Course! This is a giant obstacle course that explains how the blood travels through the heart and out to different parts of the body. In class, we colored a "map" of the heart and then completed the course. If you have not seen your child's picture, ask them about it and see if they can teach you for a change!




In the month of February we will be exploring different challenges with jumbo cup stacking and jump roping!

#### IMC News You Can Use

Part of Mr. Selmon's job as the resident Media Specialist is that he gets to talk to the students about what media is and the impact it has on our day to day lives. Books and magazines represent print media, and the Internet represents digital media.

Students in 3rd through 5th grade have been discussing media literacy during their Library times. While reading literacy is important, media literacy just as important. <u>Common Sense Media</u>, a non-profit agency that focuses on how media impacts culture, defines media literacy as the ability to identify different types of media and understand the messages they're sending.

Kids take in a huge amount of information from a wide array of sources, far beyond the **traditional** media (TV, radio, newspapers, books, and magazines). Being literate in all modes of media is essential.
