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
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If you have a child (or know of someone who has one) who is ready for kindergarten, please encourage them to register NOW in the Horizon office (between 7:00am - 3:30pm).

Kindergarten - must be 5 years old before Sept. 1, 2018 PreSchool - must be 4 years old before Sept. 1, 2018

Immunizations are REQUIRED for Kindergarten admission & also for kids going into 6th grade.

Throughout the month of April, Mrs. Cussen's class did an author study on Mo Willems. We read many books in the Gerald and Piggie series, as well as the Pigeon series. He is a fantastic storyteller! He has helped all of the students find joy in reading books! In addition to reading, we compared two different Gerald and Piggie stories, wrote our own speech bubbles that went with pictures, and studied author's craft. We learned that Mo Willems uses thinking bubbles, speech bubbles, movement/motion lines, all capital letters in some words, and big words to help readers understand the stories that he writes. "Can we read another Gerald and Piggie story?" are the words that we hear often in Mrs. Cussen's class now!

Mrs. Moore and Mrs. Curry's Kindergarten classes enjoyed some time reading in the dark with flashlights! Flashlight Friday has become one of our favorite "must do" activities. This time of year is filled with so much joy as we watch and listen to students share their love for reading!

with their classmates! Wow, reading is fun!






5th grade News:
