Here we are in the final stretch of the year. What a joy to see the growth in your children each day. The Kindergarten kids are looking a lot more like 1st graders these days, and the 5th graders are anxious to become "middle-schoolers". It truly is a season of visible change.

I am very proud of the many achievements of our students this year. We've seen significant gains in reading and math levels, as well as a surge in the amount and quality of writing being produced in our classrooms. In fact, we just learned that all 28 of the amazing writers in Ms. Krueger's 2nd grade class will have their poems published in the 2017 Young American Poetry Digest. In other news, Horizon students Cameron Wittendorf and Chloe Hall (part of Team Flufflepuff) are in St. Louis competing in the First Lego League World Championships. We can't wait to hear how they do this year. Horizon's tradition of excellence is alive and well!

The month of May is notoriously busy for many reasons. Right now, grades K-1 are doing their DIBELS end-of-year benchmark testing. Upper grades are finishing ISTEP+, which will wrap up by May 5th. (Thank you to our visitors for following test security protocols while in the building during ISTEP+.) Following ISTEP+, students in grades 2-5 will take the Scholastic Reading Inventory test (Lexile reading level), and the NWEA test will be administered to select students who are in the final phase of High Ability testing. Needless to say, our computers and our students are getting a workout this month! In addition to end of year testing, May brings us Kindergarten screening, the 5th Grade Celebration, Scholastic Book Fair, Teacher Appreciation Week, Show Choir's annual concert, and "Go For the Gold" Gold Medalists trip to Barnes & Noble, and several other field trips and events.

Horizon is a great school because of the strong, positive relationships between students, parents, and teachers. Please encourage your kids to put forth their best academic and behavioral effort each day, right up until the last day of school on June 7th. We promise to maintain our high expectations each day until the very end and encourage you to do the same. Thank you for your role in keeping the home-school relationship strong and for all you do to keep Horizon a 4-star, grade "A" school.

MyOn: Earlier this school year, the state of Indiana was gifted a subscription of MyOn. It is an Online Reading Program that gave us virtual access to over **5,000+** books that could be read from any computer, anywhere.

Originally, MyOn was available until December 2016 but it was extended into February 2017. Unfortunately, we have lost access to that virtual reading program. If you are still trying to access it at home, it is no longer available for free. There are other online programs that are available.

Second Grade News





Car Drop Off in the Mornings!

If your child <u>can</u> ride the bus, PLEASE have them ride it. We have so many cars coming through in the morning & could reduce that number if parents would let their kids ride the bus.

If you must drop off your kids, please try to drop your kids off between 7:40 - 7:50am when our traffic aides are on duty. During this time, you can simply drop them off along the curb by door B (not using the front parking lot). If you are dropping them off after 7:50am, when our traffic aides are no longer on duty, please follow this safety procedure:

- 1. Park in the front parking lot (do not stop along the curb).
- 2. Walk your child to Door A (do not send them in alone it is extremely unsafe to let children walk across the parking lot alone)
- 3. If it is after 7:55am, you will need to go into the main office and sign them in.

Dress Code Reminders...

- **1.** Shorts should come closer to the knee (no short-shorts).
- 2. <u>Leggings</u> & spandex athletic wear are not considered pants. If wearing leggings/spandex, students must wear a long shirt that comes to mid-thigh. (completely covers their bottom even when arms are raised)
- 3. <u>Sleeves</u> must cover the shoulder (no tank tops).
- **4.** <u>Dress for success at school,</u> not like you're going to the gym, a play date, or to the beach. Thank you!
