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#### <u>Cold Weather / Dress Code Reminders</u>

While we'd all prefer the sunny days of summer, reality is setting in....the cold weather is coming! Here are a few friendly recommendations for dressing your kids for school in the cold weather months.



 Please send your child to school in long pants, long sleeves, and shoes that completely cover the foot (no sandals). Girls who wear skirts/dresses should have leggings/tights on - no bare legs. Brrrrrl

Always be sure your child wears boots to school & has a pair of shoes to change into. We

don't want kids wearing their snowy boots all day.

 Kids must have a winter coat, snow pants, snow boots (not fashion boots), hat/hood, mittens/gloves in order to play in the snow at recess. Kids without proper snow gear will remain on the paved, black-top area only during recess.

Kids should never throw or kick snow or ice. (No snowballs, sorry))

• Kids may build snow forts, snowmen/snowwomen, & snow sculptures - this is lots of fun & the kids can be so creativel (Please do not send snow tools or toys to school.)

- <u>Play word games.</u>—Word games such as crossword puzzles and Scrabble help build vocabulary and word understanding.
- Read aloud every night.
- Model reading as an enjoyable activity.
- <u>Put their learning to use.</u>—Help children remember by having them explain information they have just read. Let them "teach" you facts from what they are reading.
- <u>Listen to books.</u>—This is a great way to provide models of fluent reading.




# 5th grade News

#### THE MINDS in MOTION LAB
