After 20 years and several thousand students walking around, the library finally got NEW CARPET! But that is not the only thing; with the new carpet comes a new layout and focus!

Three major sections of the Library have been shifted and more books have been added.

Students in 4th and 5th grade have been given the opportunity to apply to be Student Library Assistants. They must fill out an application, write an essay about why they want to be a library assistant and convince me they will be responsible. They must also get a teacher recommendation. There is an after school training they must attend once they are selected.

4th and 5th grade students are also being held more accountable for the things they learn in the Library. We will be using Google Classroom to do projects based on what they have learned, just like in their regular classrooms.

The younger grades continue to be introduced to the general principles of the Library and how to find "GOOD FIT BOOKS".

Horizon's fourth grade has a brand new look!

Did you know that all students rotate to three or four different blocks of curriculum each day?

The students attend one block of Language Arts, Math, Writing, Science/ Social Studies.

Language Arts teachers are: Mrs. Rehlander and Mrs. Roberts,

Mrs. Rulli and Mrs. Lira are the Math instructors.

Mrs. Rehlander and Mrs. Rulli also teach a block of writing, as Mrs. Roberts and Mrs. Lira handle the science and social studies curriculum. So your students are being instructed by at least two different fourth grade teachers each day. When students were asked how they like the new structure, their answers included:

> "It's fun to meet different teachers." "I like being with different groups of students." "It is cool to be able to walk and move around between blocks." "It sure makes the day go faster!"

Please know that the 4th grade teachers are working very diligently to be consistent in their procedures. We ask parents to please help with checking and returning agendas and purple take home folders each day. We also hope that all parents/guardians will accept their child's teachers' invites to join <u>Remind</u>. Remind is a program/app that allows parents to receive important classroom information via cell phone or email. The information on how to join these groups was sent home with each student on Thursday, August 31. If you need information, please contact your student's homeroom teacher.



Horizon's school-wide reading incentive program is STARTING October 1st. <u>"Go for the Gold"</u> is designed to encourage outside-of-school reading (reading for enjoyment). Each grade level has a goal for earning a Bronze, Silver, or GOLD medal in this program.
